Family Emergency Plan

Make sure your family has a plan in case of an emergency. **Before** an emergency happens, sit down together and decide how you will be in contact with each other, where you will go, and what you will do in an emergency. The City of Tangent is hoping its citizens will use the attached form to help you put all this information where all family members can easily access it.

You should also have some basic supplies on hand to help you and your family survive through the first hours and days of an emergency. The following are some suggestions of what to have on hand: One gallon of water per person per day for at least three days; at least a three day supply of non-perishable food; battery-powered or hand crank radio and a NOAA weather radio with tone alert and extra batteries for both; flashlight and extra batteries; first aid kit; whistle to signal for help; dust mask to help filter contaminated air and plastic sheeting and duct tape to shelter-in-place; moist towelettes, garbage bags, and plastic ties for personal sanitation; wrench or pliers to turn off utilities; can opener for food, if needed; local maps; prescription medication and glasses; infant formula and diapers, if needed; pet food and extra water if you have a pet; important family documents; sleeping bag or warm blanket for each person.
